The School

Community Christian School (CCS) exists for families who sincerely desire a Biblically based education for students in K2 through 12th grade. CCS has provided traditional Christian education in Manatee and Sarasota Counties since 1968. Through the years the Lord has wonderfully guided and met the needs of the school.

Church Affiliation

Community Christian School is a ministry of Community Baptist Church. Teachers who are hired are required to join the membership of the church or a church of like minded faith. Pastor Wayne Golson is senior pastor of the church. Pastor Golson is a graduate of Bob Jones University and has pastored CBC for over 29 years.

Demographics

CCS is situated on 20 acres in the city of Bradenton lying on Florida's West Coast along the shoreline of the Gulf of Mexico. Sprawling over much of the western section of Manatee County, Bradenton is home to over 45,000 people.

Manatee County is an area just south of Tampa Bay at the southern approach to the Sunshine Skyway Bridge. The County's largest employer is the Tropicana Co., a distributor of citrus products. Other

leading industries include boat building, banking and financial services, and agriculture. The area's beaches attract thousands of tourists each year.

Bradenton has all the amenities offered by a large metropolitan area. Bradenton has a number of large hospitals and shopping centers and is just a short distance from the cultural centers of Sarasota, Tampa, and St. Petersburg. The Sarasota/Bradenton International Airport is conveniently located just south of the city.

Academics

CCS is a member of the Sunshine State Association of Christian Schools (SSACS) and has been continuously accredited since the 1970's. The school is also a member of, and accredited by the American Association of Christian Schools (AACS), a national education group. In addition CCS has regional and state accreditation through the North American Christian School Accrediting Agency (NACSA). CCS High School credits and diplomas are accepted by most schools throughout the country.

Curriculum

Community Christian School offers a comprehensive curriculum to meet the needs of its students. In the traditional Christian education program at CCS, phonics is taught in K2-2nd grade; all the basics are taught in elementary classes; and science labs, computer labs, and all required courses are taught in junior and senior high classes. Music classes are taught to K5 through senior high students. Band is a requirement in 6th through 8th grade as well as having a comprehensive program in senior high. Also, a childcare program compliments the preschool. CCS strives to produce students who excel in academics, athletics, and an appreciation of God-honoring music. CCS uses A Beka, Bob Jones, and Saxon math curriculums.

Graduation Requirements

CCS requires senior high students to complete a program that is at least equivalent to the State of Florida

requirements. Students who graduate from CCS must accumulate at least 24 credits to graduate from high school. A college-prep diploma of 28 credits is available to all high school students.

The minimum requirements for graduation in order to earn a 24 credit high school diploma from CCS are listed below:
